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ong overdue, here is our first catalogue of our highly respected Russian born and trained painter Viktor

Butko (b. 1978, Moscow). Well on his way to having a distinguished international career, Butko has shown work in museums and galleries around the world almost every year since he was 22 years old. He is also already represented in several museum collections. Butko's work immediately stood out for its draftsmanship and compositional excellence at the inaugural show of the Russian American Painting Alliance in 2016. Over the years, our clients have also noticed Butko's excellence, as many of his paintings sell as soon as they are delivered to the gallery. Since the paintings find homes so quickly, we decided that it was important to show the best works in this catalogue, even though some of them are already sold

I first met Butko with a group of 4 Russians, and almost twice as many Americans, when they all arrived in the Hamptons in October 2016, after painting together in Maine. Ben Fenske and I formed the Russian American Painting Alliance to reciprocate an invitational painting trip that a group of Grenning Gallery painters had attended in 2014 to Plyos, Russia. On that trip, despite the language barrier, a fast friendship formed, and Butko and Fenske began painting together. The day I met Butko, the only thing I could glean from our conversation was his question "Where could he buy a big bag of potatoes (for eating) and Vodka (to warm him up while painting out in the frigid autumn air)". Butko's relationship to the Grenning Gallery and the American painting scene has only grown from there, as well as his ability to speak English. He has permanently relocated to the Boston area, where he lives and paints with his American wife. He also spends several months a year living on Shelter Island and painting local scenes here.

As the third generation in a family of painters, ensconced in classical training, Butko's singular focus on creating art has served him well. His unfettered dedication reveals itself as he works in one inspired series after another. Shelter Island any time of day, any time of year inspires him. The heavy snowfalls last winter brought out his Russian roots, and he painted some of the most charming snow scenes of the East End I have ever seen. Intoxicated by the twilight sky and a smudge of moonlight has yielded a wonderful series of moonscapes on the East End. We are excited to be a part of Viktor Butko's unfolding career, especially as we get to be in the wake of his rich and painterly approach to our local landscape.





















Viktor Butko was born into a family of artists in Moscow in 1978. He often visited the studio of his grandfather, the famous artist Victor Chulovich, where upon seeing the live creation of oil paintings, his imagination was ignited. Butko's first steps in art were directed by his grandfather and then his parents, who are also notable artists in Russia; Nickolay Butko and Marina Chulovich. When he came of age, Butko studied at the Moscow Art School, a leading center for classical training at the time. After school, Butko was honored to be invited to paint at the Academic Dacha of Artists, which was originally created by the great 19th century Russian artist Ilya Repin. The retreat was specifically designed for top post graduate students of the Academy of Fine Arts. There, Butko worked under the guidance of notable artists Alexey Gritsay and bothers Alexei and Sergei Tkachev. The latter pair had a big influence on the creative path of his work. The Tkachev brothers, older and respected Russian impressionist artists, claim that Butko's work is the "....next generation of greatness".

In 1998, when Butko was a mere 20 years old, famed American collectors of Russian art Ray Johnson, Jim Dabakis and Vern Swenson discovered him. They met him while scouring the studio building for famous Soviet artists' work to buy for their growing collection, which is now housed at the Museum of Russian Art in Minneapolis (TMORA). They came looking for Butko's grandfather's work but saw Butko's sketches and offered to help him get a US show. Butko's first solo show was held a few years later in 2002 at the McCarthey Gallery in Park City, Utah. McCarthey was

one of the foremost dealers in the United States for Russian Impressionist paintings. This marked the beginning of a long cooperation with McCarthey Gallery. In fact, Butko has been showing regularly in the US, Russia and China since he was 22 years old. In 2016, Butko accepted an invitation from the Russian American Painting Alliance, founded by Ben Fenske and Laura Grenning. There he joined close to 15 painters for a month in Maine and another month in the Hamptons. The Grenning Gallery curated and hosted an exhibit of the group in Sag Harbor that November.

Butko's work can be found in the Vyshniy Volochek Museum, the Institute of Russian Realistic Art Museum as well as many private collections in Russia, China and across the U.S. Butko paints in Sag Harbor, Maine, Boston and New York, as well as Russia and Italy. His work can be found in the Grenning Gallery, Watson Gallery, Williams Fine Art and the McCarthey Gallery. He lives with his wife, painter Kelly Carmody, in Waltham Massachusetts, where they paint and teach in and around their studio. They often travel to Shelter Island, New York, where they stay and paint locally.
